

COUNSELOR & PPOINTMENTS



- STUDENTS Stop by guidance before school, during lunch, or during a free period to schedule an appointment.
- PARENTS Email your child's counselor to set up an appointment. Counselors can be reached by phone or email.

^{*}The Committee on Special Education (CSE) may exempt a student from this requirement if deemed necessary.



- All students must earn a minimum of 22 credits to graduate in various subject areas, as well as pass at least one Regents exams in each discipline (English, math, social studies, and science), plus one pathway assessment in one of the following areas: STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), Humanities, CTE, The Arts, Civics, or Languages Other Than English (LOTE).
- Types of Diplomas include:
 - Local
 - Regents
 - Advanced Regents
- Types of Seals include:
 - Honors
 - Mastery in Math
 - Mastery in Science
 - Career and Technical Education (CTE)
 - State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB)
 - Civics of Engagement



- Students must earn a minimum of 22 credits to graduate (English, social studies, math, science, world language, health, art/music, physical education, and electives).
- A Regents diploma requires a minimum passing score of 65 on five Regents exams.
- An Advanced Regents Diploma consists of a minimum passing score of 65 on eight Regents exams and one LOTE Checkpoint B Exam.
- Honors Designation is available for both diploma types and requires an average of 90 and above on the associated Regents exams.
- Mastery in Math and Mastery in Science is available for the Advanced Regents Diploma and requires that students pass with a minimum score of 85 or better on three commencement level Regents examinations in math, and/or three commencement level Regents examinations in science.

PROMOTION POLICY

Roosevelt High School students are required to carry a minimum of 5 credits in core subjects plus physical education each school year, in order to promote to the next grade level. Core subjects include:

- English
- Social Studies
- Math
- Science
- LOTE/World Languages

Please check with your counselor to review credits earned to-date.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN JUNIOR YEAR

HONORS/ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COLLEGE COURSEWORK

- Student recommendations provided by teachers.
- Students may self-select into advanced classes but are strongly recommended to discuss their interests with their school counselor, teacher, and grade level assistant principal.
- Students registered in Advanced Placement (AP) courses must take the culminating College Board AP examination, which is administered in May. Students and families are responsible for absorbing the cost of each AP exam.
- Virtual AP courses are offered outside the school day and any student interested in registering MUST see their counselor, by the preferred deadline of May 15th.



SCHEDULING FOR 2022-2023

- Student course elective selections were completed through a Google Form in February.
- Teacher recommendations completed in March.
- Courses required for graduation and per NYS regulations will be prioritized over elective selections. This includes IEP mandates, AIS services, 504, ELL placements, etc.
- Review course requests via the portal and complete verification forms (sent by mail), and submit into guidance no later than this Friday, April 8th.



WHAT CAN NAVIANCE DO?


- Compares colleges and universities.

- Offers career and interest inventories.








- Grasp of grammar, ability to create a lucid, structured prose; and a vivid portrait of the student's personality and character

- Community Service

- Awards and Recognitions
- Work/Summer Experiences

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

2 academic recommendations

- Students request letters in May
- Junior year teachers are preferred
- 5 core subjects:
 - English
 - Social Studies
 - Math
 - Science
 - LOTE

1 counselor recommendation

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Student Support Services
- Portfolio requirements
 - Fine Arts, Graphic Design, Architecture, Writing, Music Composition
- Audition deadlines
 - Drama, Music, Voice, Dance
- Athletics
 - Division I, Division II, or Division III



NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE



- All student-athletes planning to participate in Division I or Division II sports
 MUST register with the clearinghouse after the *completion* of junior year
 (following the sixth semester), or at the *start* of senior year (September).
- To register, students MUST file online at www.eligibilitycenter.org. Print out the NCAA Records Release Form and submit to your counselor.
- Review credit counts and core conversion units with your school counselor.
- Speak with your high school and/or regional coaches.

HELPFUL TIPS

- College is an investment!
- Demonstrate interest
 - Information session
 - Campus tour
 - Attend a class
 - Meet with academic department representatives and/or coaches
 - Meet with financial aid representatives
 - Interview (then send a thank you letter)!
 - Attend alumni programs

- Establish a solid rapport with your teachers!
- Get to know your school counselor!
- Know where to access the High School Curriculum Guide!
- Familiarize yourself with graduation requirements!
- Choose activities that interest you!
- Manage your time wisely!

- Attend college and technical school visits held here at the HS!
